BURSARY STUDENT STORY

This term the Catholic Education Foundation assisted a father who was left to raise seven children when mum passed away from cancer in 2023. As dad is now the sole carer of his seven children, he has had to leave work and become Centrelink dependent.

One son attends a public High School, another has high needs and attends a specialised school. The CEF is proudly providing a Financial Bursary to a son in Year 6, a daughter in Year 3 and triplets who have been enrolled into Kindergarten in 2025.

In addition to the Financial Bursary support, dad has been struggling to provide food for all his children. Last year the parent community cooked meals for him to collect every afternoon to take home as the Primary school students were arriving at school hungry. The school and Parish also supplied them with breakfast and lunch at a cost of \$50.00 per week which has now become unsustainable. The CEF has been in contact with our Corporate Partners and they will ensure this support can continue in 2024.
