A Year 11 students' parents were facing significant financial hardship due to long-term struggles. The College had previously been unable to resolve the outstanding school fees, leading to the account being transferred to the School Fee Support Unit.

With both parents experiencing mental health challenges, it took seven months to gather the necessary paperwork for a Financial Hardship Bursary application. The Salvation Army provided invaluable support by assisting with paperwork, document collection, and financial counseling. They are also negotiating on behalf of the family for other outstanding debts.

Thanks to the bursary, the family now has lessened their financial worries and is grateful. They can now feel comfortable to support their child with their final 2 vears of schooling.

They value Catholic education and their faith and active members of their parish. They are very grateful for basic assistance provided by the local community.

The second CLMP country experience, following Gunnedah in 2023, was the Forbes Experience 15-19 April 2024. Staff and students traveled by train from Central to Orange and then took the bus to the accommodation at Red Bend Catholic College in Forbes. The College arranged for use of their Bus and Driver which was exceptional as he had local knowledge to share with us.

Students had the opportunity to meet with farmers, local businesses and enjoy a shearing shed visit. They also visited Parkes CSIRO Radio Telescope which was made even more significant by the presentation by Mr John Sarkissian, Chief Operations Scientist at the site and an ex-student of Marist College Penshurst.
